

## Creativity Prompt

#### **YOU ARE ART**

# "THERE'S NEVER BEEN ANYONE EXACTLY LIKE YOU BEFORE, AND THERE WILL NEVER BE AGAIN."

#### Description

Be reminded that you are a work of art through self-observation and writing and use your artistic perspective to share about the subject you know best.

#### **Time to Complete**

5-10 Minutes

#### **Materials**

Pen/pencil and paper, mirror (optional)

#### Instructions

Ponder this quote from Mr. Rogers:

"You are a very special person. There is only one like you in the whole world. There's never been anyone exactly like you before, and there will never be again. Only you. And people can like you exactly as you are"

The human form has always been one of the greatest sources of inspiration for artist like Walt Whitman's (who was himself a huge fan of opera!), "I sing the body electric", or painter Frida Kahlo's many moving self-portraits. Frida said famously, "I paint self-portraits because I am so often alone, because I am the subject I know best".

Consider the subject you know best, you! Like "the back of your hand" as some people say.

Grab a pen or pencil and paper. Look at yourself for as long as you like or think about your inner beauty and find the part you want to describe; maybe it is your eyebrows (like Frida) or one of your joints (like Whitman), or literally the back or your hand! Describe it briefly. For example:

The back of my hand looks like my father's.

The knuckles are big and bumpy

And have ridges and valleys like the topography

of life.

I like that about myself.

Continued on back

Or

My big toe is lumpy like the good kind of guacamole.

### **Optional Add On**

Turn your description into a song!
